

On 3rd April 2023, the school celebrated this year's Founder's Day in an informative and educational approach. The article on our Founder was distributed to all the classes one week before the celebration for the students to read and study his legacy. The Deputy Principal presented the biography in PPT on Dr. Thio Chan Bee (1904-1978), the founder of the school during the assembly. The challenges of his childhood days, his excellent academic performance in the Cambridge Examinations, his dedication in his career as a teacher, Vice Principal and later as the first Asian Principal of the Anglo Chinese School in Singapore were highlighted in the presentation. He was also teaching in Sunday School and actively involved in Church activities. As a fully committed Christian whose life decisions were guided by God, holding himself to high moral standards. His teaching encompassed the values of hard work, cooperation, encouragement and Christian principles. He strongly believed in aspiration, inspiration, perspiration and perseverance can only lead to success in life. In 1968, he founded the Association for the Promotion of Higher Education in Malaysia (APHEM) with several distinguished personalities to promote Dr. Thio's vision of using education as a medium to foster interracial and interreligious understanding, goodwill and cooperation among young Malaysian. Despite several obstacles that arose,

APHEM continued to excel Kolej Genting Highlands into Sekolah Menengah Highlands and later went incorporate Highlands



In commemoration of Dr. Thio's efforts, dedication and vision, the school celebrates his birthday every year as Founder's Day to remind all Highlanders to always explore their talents, enrich themselves by facing and drawing strength from all obstacles and excel in whatever they do for the betterment of their own lives, families, the society, the nation and the world. The highlight of the celebration was where the students and teachers were engaged in a quiz on the Founder via google forms. For the follow up activity, several literature on Dr. Thio were recommended for further reading for both the teachers and students of HIBS.




Ethics in Education

The 'Ethics in Education' training programme was held on 31 March 2023 in Highlands International Boarding School (HIBS) in line with its ethics programme. The school invited two speakers – Dr Nagiah Ramasamy, Associate Prof of HRM/IR, Sunway University (Retired) and Prof Datuk Denison Jayasooria, Society for Promotion of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Dr Nagiah, an ethics practitioner and educator with 27 years of administrative and teaching experience, started the session by defining 'What is Ethics'. He stated that ethics refers to the moral value of human conduct and moral principles that control or influence a person's behavior. Ethics deals with standards set by organisations or professional bodies to regulate members' behavior in the profession.

Dr Nagiah's posed four questions that one should consider when determining if one's action is ethical and they are:

- 1. Child on your shoulder: Are you OK for doing the action, even if your children are watching?
- 2. Front paper story: Would you feel OK if the action/behaviour become the front-page story in your local newspaper?
- 3. Golden rule: Are you comfortable for being on the receiving end of this action or decisions?
- 4. Rule of universality: Would you be OK if everyone in the world would behave or act that way?







Dr Nagiah went on to highlight acts of unethical behaviour in educational institutions that must be avoided. He then went on to state that teaching is a noble profession that is held in the highest esteem, and teachers are seen as role models by all stakeholders. Unethical conduct destroys trust and respect among other teachers, students, parents, and most importantly the institutions they represent. Datuk Dr Denison Jayasooria, President of Society for Promotion of Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) started his talk saying he wanted us to do some reflection on ethics in present day context. The ethical challenges globally are reflected in the rising level of corruption and abuse of power globally. He said, in this day and age there is parental difficulties and crisis in parenting. This puts pressure on teachers in school. The teaching profession today is not only to produce academic student, but to mould and instil in students ethical and moral characters and develop them as leaders in community. The way the teacher act is the lesson to both students and community as well as how they should live. Dr Denison draw on some universal thoughts and highlighted the saying from Dada Bhagwan that states: "In this world, it is not possible to forget about obligation of three people: father, mother and guru; the one who has made us walk on the correct path." He went on to say that the teaching profession plays a great contributing role in shaping and igniting young minds and be models where students can be reminded of the right approaches to ethical and moral conduct that impacts the future. After the talk, the printed HIBS Code of Conduct was distributed to all present by the human resource department.
